The focus of this position will be to work on growing the Museum's community presence by promoting and diversifying the current reach of the organization and to attract and better engage with groups outside the Museum's current developed partnerships. This position will also work alongside the Outreach and Programming Coordinator to create and develop new programming initiatives. There will also be the ability to develop marketing and social media materials for the Outreach Department, with assistance from the Design Associate, Design and Engagement Lead, and the Outreach and Programming Coordinator. This position will contribute to the Museum's Cultural development to be able to better provide curriculum based and customized programming about the vast Culture and Heritage of Sault Ste. Marie.

Other duties include but are not limited to day-to-day operation of the Museum, opening and closing, interacting with visitors, and ensuring all information is presented in a friendly, positive, and accurate manner.
